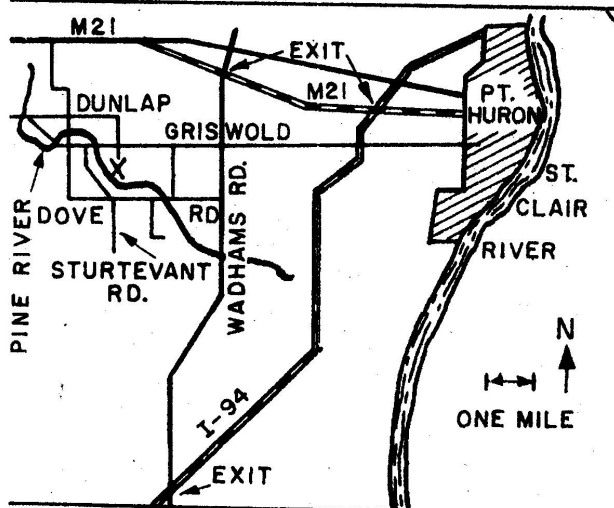
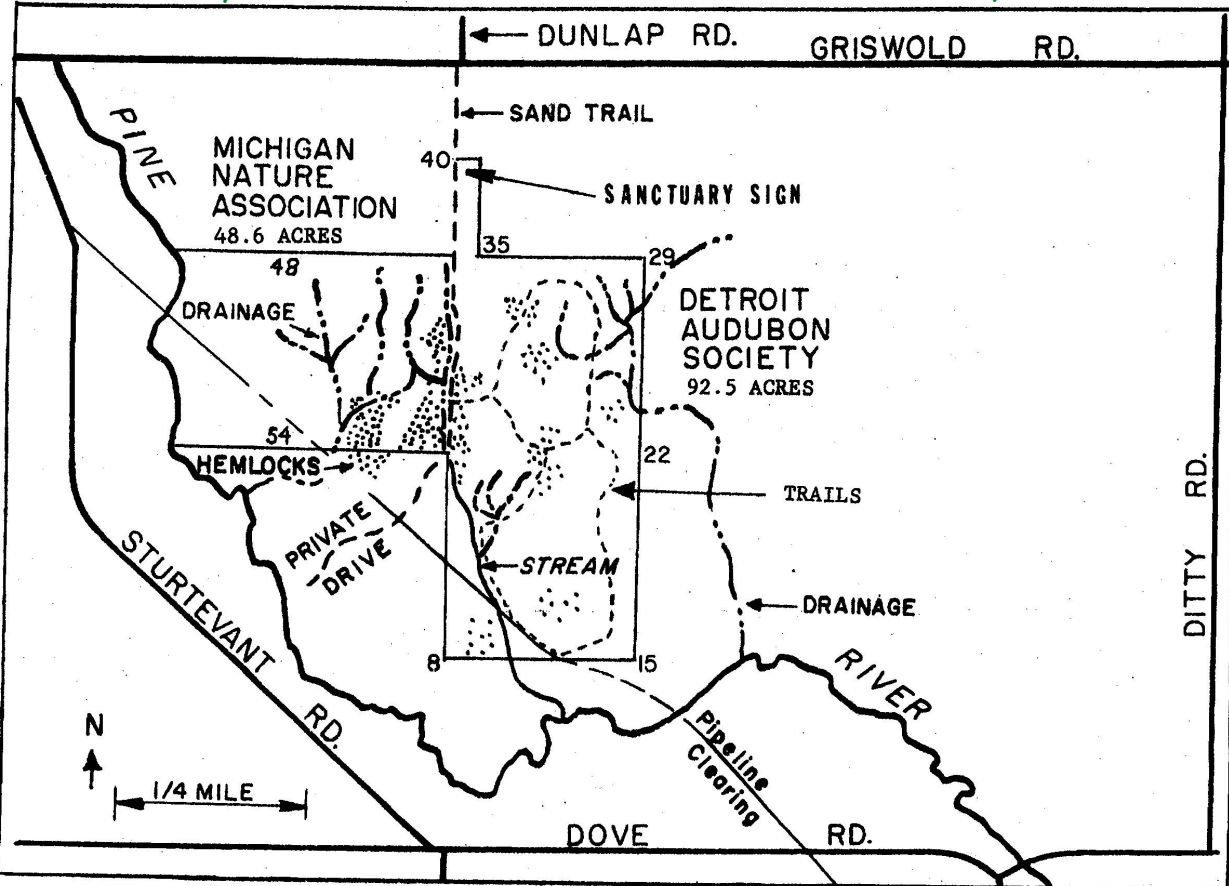

To Visit the Sanctuary:

This beautifully wooded sanctuary can be visited at any time. Wear sturdy waterproof footwear and bring insect repellent and a compass. Trails are marked by blue stakes. Places where the trail forks are marked by two stakes. The numbers on the map represent boundary markers. Three or four cars may be pulled in just north of the sanctuary sign, or park along Griswold Road and walk down the sand trail. Remember that collecting, cutting, hunting, and off-road vehicles are prohibited. Many species of birds and wildflowers can be seen, especially in spring and early summer. Several visits may be necessary to explore all of this 141 acre sanctuary.
